

# Safari Cookie Setting Controls

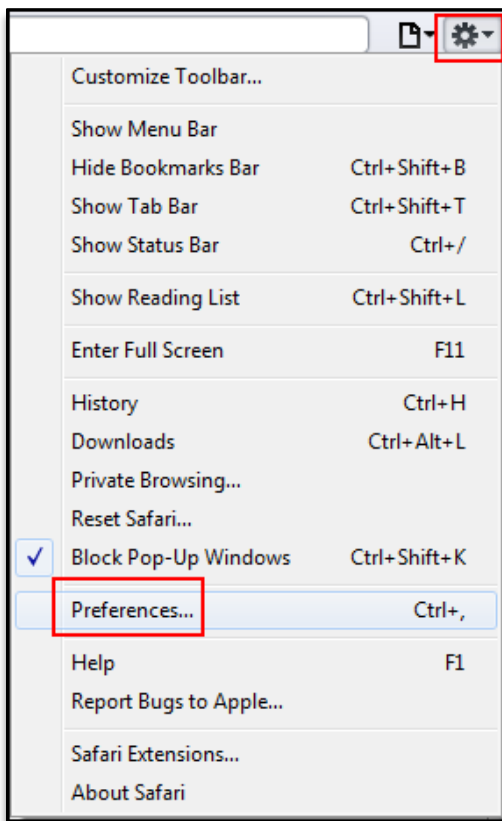
Use this procedure to clear the cookies set by the online banking website, and then register your computer as private.

**Note:**

By registering your computer as private, you will avoid recurring security challenge questions from online banking.

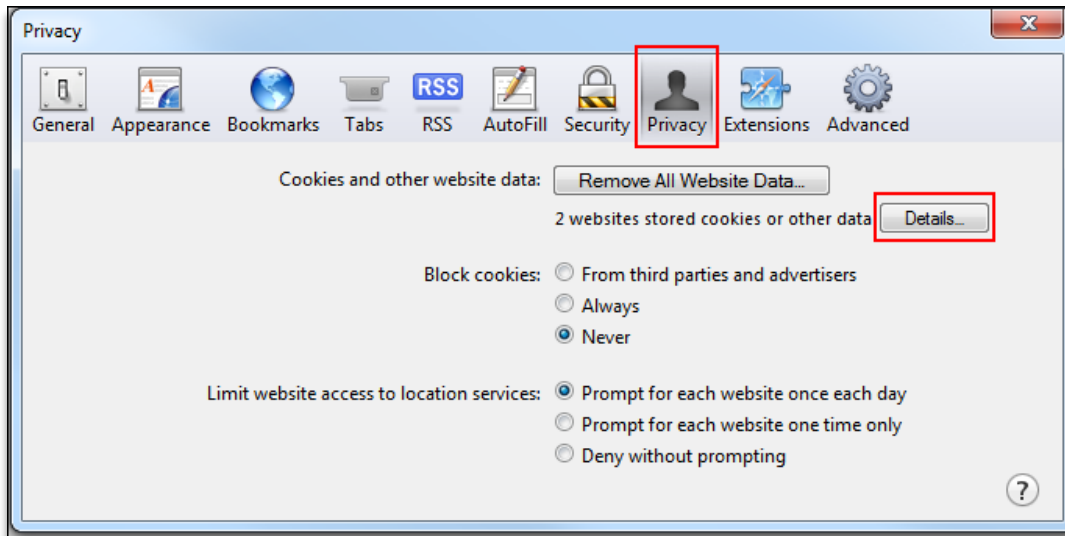
To update your Safari cookie setting controls:

1. From your desktop, open **Safari**.
2. Click the **drop-down arrow** from the menu icon to display a menu of general Safari settings.
3. Click Preferences. The General window displays.

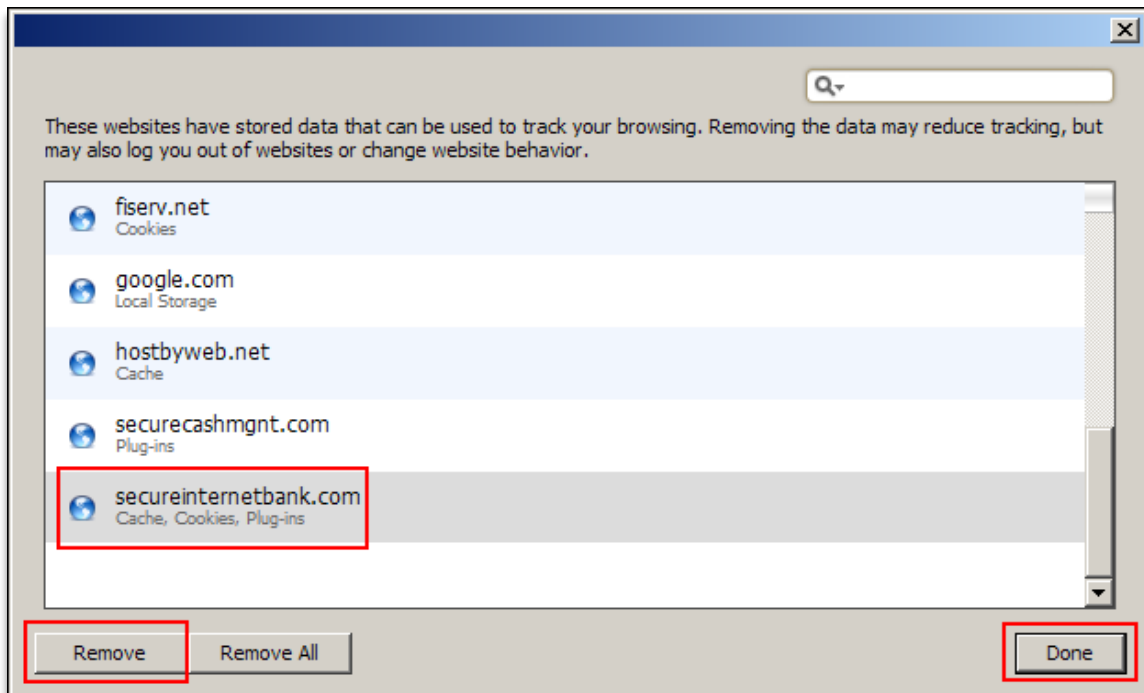

4. Click **Privacy**. The Privacy window displays.
5. Select the **Details** button.



6. Locate and select **SecureInternetBank.com**.
7. Click **Remove**.
8. Click **Done** to remove the cache, cookies and Plug-ins. Close the Privacy window.

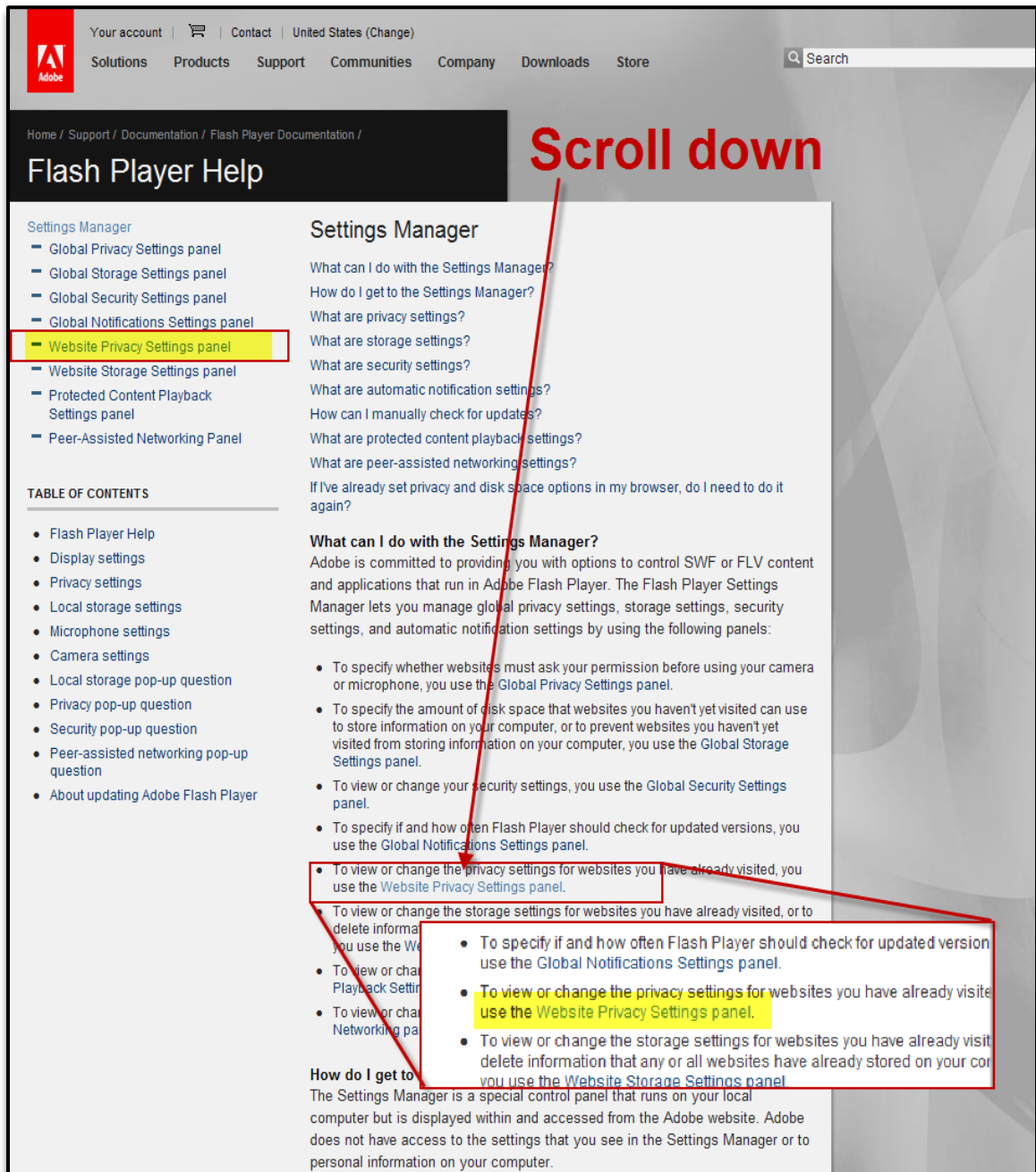
- To remove the Flash Shared Object (FSO), navigate to the Adobe Flash Player Settings Manager Website located at the following URL:

**Notes:**

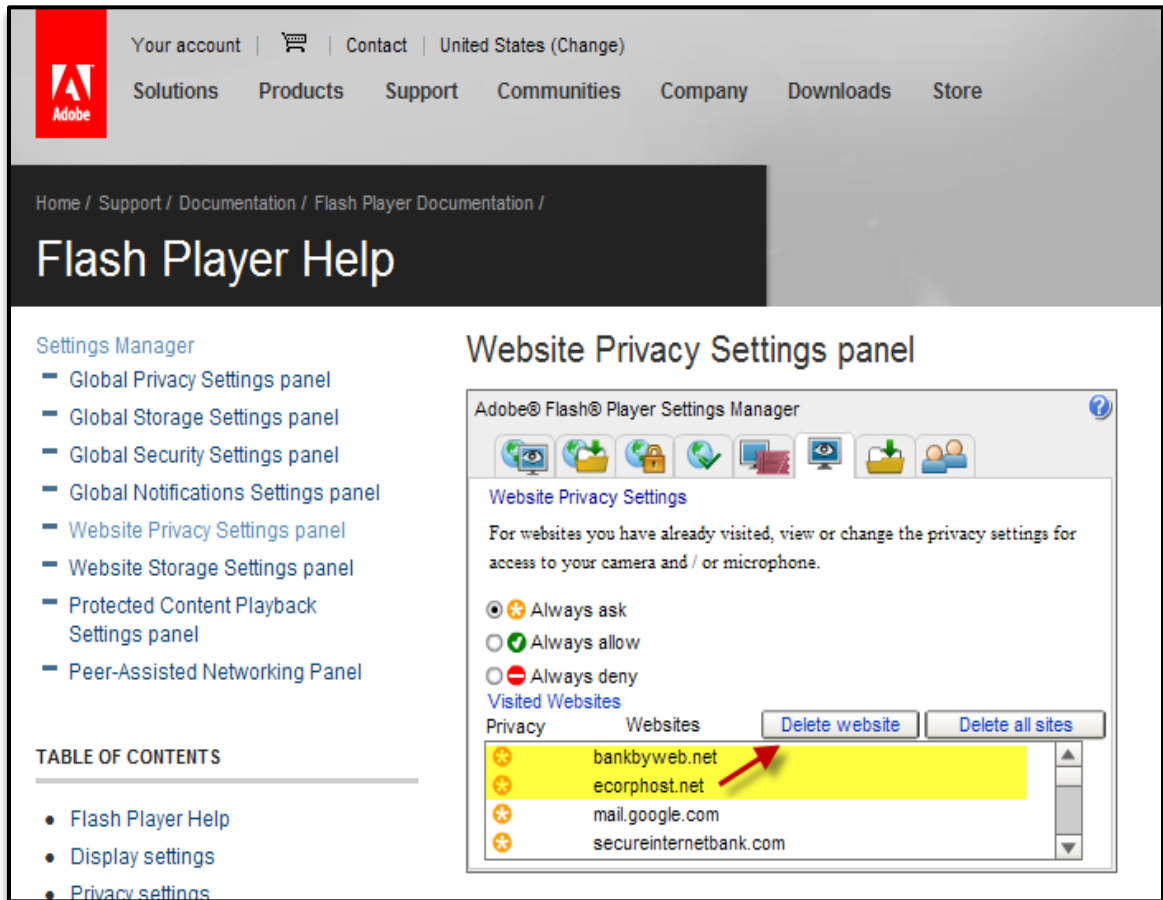
- The FSO allows users to register a computer as Private.
- You may want to access these settings again later so we suggest that you bookmark this link.

- Scroll down the page and in the **What can I do with the Settings Manager?** section, select the **Website Privacy Settings panel** link. The Website Privacy Setting panel displays with a list of Visited Websites.

11. Select **secureinternetbank.com** from the list of Visited Websites.
12. Click the **Delete Website** button.



13. Click the **Confirm** button to remove the Flash Shared Object (FSO). Repeat step 14 through 16 for all items you want to delete.

**Note:**

To clear all FSO on the computer, click **Delete All Sites**, rather than removing them one by one.

14. Login to your financial institution website with your Access ID. You will be challenged by Multi-factor Authentication upon login, but after successfully completing the Multi-factor Authentication challenge, you can register the computer as a personal computer to avoid further security challenge questions.

**Note:**

Only one browser can be registered at a time. If you jump back and forth between Safari and other browsers such as Firefox, Internet Explorer or Google Chrome, all other browsers will require a challenge question.
